The Coyote coaches will emphasize instruction in the fundamental skills of hitting, pitching, fielding, catching, and throwing. Analysis of strengths and suggested improvements will be made. A small player-to-coach ratio will enable each player to receive maximum personalized instruction. Goals are to stress improvement, development, and the realization of each player's potential. Evening activities include video analysis of hitting and/or pitching. For groups of five or more we use the same video. The cassette is returned to their coach. Overnighters have supervised use of the gymnasium, racquetball court, and weight room.

AGE REQUIREMENTS, DATES, AND TIMES

13-18 YEARS (GRADES 7-12) December 28, 29, 30 9:30 am – 3:00 pm

COST – The cost of this camp is \$120.00 for day campers and \$190.00 for overnighters. All campers receive excess liability insurance, instruction, lunch and T-shirt. Overnighters additionally will receive breakfast, dinner, and evening activities. 24 hour supervision will be performed by the coaching staff and camp counselors.

LOCATION – The camp will be held at the Raymond A. McCue Athletic Complex (AKA "The Dawg Yard) located at Cerro Coso Community College, 3000 College Heights Blvd., Ridgecrest, CA. 93555

INCLEMENT WEATHER CONDITION – In the event of inclement or unforeseen conditions, the camp staff reserves the right to adjust the schedule. December temperatures in Ridgecrest range from 50 to 65 degrees. If poor weather occurs, we will move the camp inside. You need non-marking tennis shoes.

INSURANCE – Excess liability insurance is provided for each participant. Expenses resulting from illness or injuries are the responsibility of the participant's parents or guardians. A local hospital is available at all times.

HOUSING – Overnight camper will be housed in the Cerro Coso Gymnasium. You will need a sleeping bag and towel. Check-in will be between 4:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. December 27 or 9:00 a.m. December 28 at the Dawg Yard.

INSTRUCTION – Includes field instruction, individual analysis during batting, catching, pitching, fielding, and throwing.

CANCELLATIONS – Full tuition, less a \$50.00 processing fee will be refunded for cancellations made at least one (1) week prior to the starting date of the camp.

COYOTE COACHING STAFF

Dick Adams begins his 18th year as the only head coach of the Cerro Coso Community College Baseball Program. He is a member of the American Baseball Coaches Associations 300 Century Club. His career record at CCC now stands at 370 wins and 320 losses (.536) as the Coyote Skipper. Coach Adams led the 1999 team to Cerro Coso's most successful season so far at 31-14, then followed that year by leading the 2000 Dawgs to a repeat of the conference championship, giving them back-2-back honors as the Foothill Conference Champions in both 1999 and 2000. Each championship allowed the Coyotes to host the First Round State Playoffs. Dick was named the Foothill Conference Coach of the Year in both 1999 and 2000.

Billy Montgomery begins his first year as an assistant coach for Cerro Coso Community College. He comes from Klamath Falls, Oregon where he was a 1997 graduate of Henley High School and a two time All-State selection. He finished his senior season as the Class 3A Oregon Player of the Year. Billy began his collegiate career at Cerro Coso as an outfielder in 1998. As a freshman he gained 2nd Team All Foothill Conference honors and helped lead the team to a 2nd place finish with a 28-12 record. Billy transferred to San Diego State University as a sophomore where he played two seasons, and was awarded All Mountain West Conference honors as a junior. Billy left SDSU after his junior season as he was drafted in the 10th round of the Amateur Baseball Draft by the Texas Rangers. After 2 season in the Minor leagues Billy began his coaching career at Western Oregon University where he was an assistant and coached the outfielders and hitters. In his three years at WOU the team compiled a 106 and 55 record. Billy will carry the responsibility of coaching outfielders, base running, and assist with the hitters this year for the Coyotes.

Bryan King begins his first year as an assistant coach for Cerro Coso Community College. King is a Denver, Co native where he graduated from Thornton High School in 1999. Kings collegiate career included stops at Colorado Northwestern Community College and the University of Northern Colorado. Coach King's coaching career began at Colorado Northwestern in 2003 where he served as an assistant coach for the Spartans for three seasons. King then moved on to the College of Southern Idaho in Twin Falls, ID where he assisted the Golden Eagles to a 40-14 record. King then returned to Colorado Northwestern as the Head Coach for the 2007-2008 seasons. Coach King's primary responsibilities will include coaching the Coyote pitchers and assist with the catchers. Professor King is currently an adjunct instructor for the Cerro Coso PE/HSCI department.

Many current Coyote players will also assist in the running of this year's camp.
